

EARLY FORMATION OF THE COROWA SERVICES BOWLS CLUB GREEN 1955

Construction of a new bowling green at the Corowa United Servicemen's Memorial Club was instigated, when Mr. F. Sammons, President of the C.U.S.M.C., in his Annual Report of 1955 said, that after a very successful year in which the membership of the Club grew to 448, it was time to lay a bowling green.

The land, which had previously been an orchard and owned by Dr. Barnard, had been cleared by Mr. Gordon Poidevin. The fruit trees had been winched and grubbed in anticipation of the construction of the

green.

Mr. Jock Cullen of Colston Timbers used a bulldozer to level the site, and Mr. Bailey Macartney who was a World War 1 Digger and an outdoor worker of the Club, constructed ditches and other hand work on site. It was all done under the supervision of Mr. Cyril Platt, a committee member of the C.U.S.M.C.

Sometime in 1956, a sub committee was formed to oversee construction and the following members were elected.

Mr. Cyril Platt, Mr. Eric Harrison, Mr. Pat Costello, and Mr. Don Stewart. All were Returned Servicemen whom had previous bowling experience at the Corowa Bowling Club.

Mr. Alec. Jamieson an earth moving contractor, formed all the surrounds of the new green. The grass was sown in 1957, and was ready to be opened on the 8th March 1958 by Mr. Clem Hill, Councillor representing the Royal Victorian Bowling Assocciation.

OFFICIAL OPENING

The official opening of the new bowling green took place on the 8th March 1957, After rain had soaked the green the previous day, committeemen worked late into the night draining water from the surface, and, on the big day, the sun peeped through. With conditions very humid, the green was a trifle heavy but very true

Mr. J. A.Lawson, M. L.A., Mr W. Johnson, Shire Pres.
Mr. A. Hill, representing the R.V.B.A., Mr.Cyril Pratt, Bowling
Club President, and representitives from _Rutherglen, Ovens and
Murray, Walla Walla, Wodonga, Oaklands, Culcairn, and Urana, were all
full of praise for the way in which the green was presented.
The oldest member present was Mr. John Izon, formerly a very keen
bowler himself.

The President of the United Servicemen's Club, **Mr F. Sammons**, welcomed everyone, and recalled that the club had been in existence for only 8 years. During that time, with the help of the Ladies Auxiliary, membership had grown to over 450, and that it was pretty unique in the fact that the club had been able to build and complete a bowling green, in such a short time.

Mrs. Lilian Parkin, Pres. Ladies Auxilary, sent down the first jack, and Mrs. J. Lawson, the first bowl

Mr. Lawson M.L.A., congratulated the club on it's community effort. He said that they had done something not only for the club but also for the district, and were looking towards a bright future

Mr. Lawson also cited the following quote ---

"A good bowler is a man who can smile when beaten, smile with the man who defeats him, and the man he defeats, and when he enters the clubroom, he leaves his bias on the green "

Afterwards everyone enjoyed afternoon tea, at which **Mr. Pratt**- Toasted the Queen. Presentations were carried out to the winners

The first **Legacy Day** was held on 16th March 1957


and won by **Mr.Goldsworthy**'s team from Wangaratta. Teams from up to 70 miles away were represented. The rinks used from 9.30am till 9.00pm.

July 1958 First Annual Meeting. Sec. Mr. J. Baldwin stated that the club had a most successful season. 1500 pounds spent on equipment, and that Frank Bell (greenkeeper) had passed exams at 100% for turf culture. Membership stood at 70 .Pennant teams had also been entered in the Ovens & Murray Assoc. for the coming season.

July 1959 Annual Meeting. Pres. Platt Thanked all concerned especially Mr. F. Sammons and Mr. Perc Smith for "matters green". footnote (It was noted that wire netting had been erected along the roadway to the north of the green, to deter any unwanted stray animals from cavorting on the green.)

A touch of humor was introduced by **Jack Baldwin** when reading the "minutes of last meeting that "*Roy Lindeman be debarred from using his steamrollers, and be instructed to use 41/2 inch bowls.*" It was also suggested that a tournament of 3 men 3 bowls be played on 1st Sunday in each month, *definetly male only*!!

Pres. Hamilton also thanked all the members who "put aside their lawns and woodcutting, to represent at their expense, the club in various tournaments around the district."

1963 Sudden death of Mr Bruce Chandler (Happy) at the young age of 43. A well known, popular, and most highly respected member, Bruce Worked at Messrs, Sammons, Edwards and Co, in Corowa and at the time of his death was assisstant manager. Members of the Corowa branch of the R.S.L. bowls formed a guard of honour at the church and cemetary.

Cyril started bowling in 1942 with the Corowa Bowling Club. Club
Champion in 1950 he was a constant player with that club until the
Corowa Services Club was formed in 1956, in which he was
instrumental was presented with a Life Membership in 1962. in
forming. He was elected President at it's first Annual Meeting and
continued in that office till ill health forced his retirement. He was
responsible for the lighting on the green, and carried out that work
single handed, which has given we bowlers much night time pleasure.

Ovens and Murray President Mr R. Flanders in his tribute said that -~ We cannot afford to lose the calibre of Cyril Pratt. Known and loved by hundreds of bowlers in the North East, Cyril was a magnificent team mate and a keen opponent, who never failed to inspire his team, and give full credit to his opponents. He will be sadly missed by all, especially Corowa Services!!

A. G. M Aug 63. meeting looked as though the Services would not be entering Pennant teams in the forthcoming season after a lowly finish last year but, after much discussion it was decided to try again. Members are concerned at the lack of interest being shown in the bowling activities and are urged to take part in practise and pennant. A day is to be put aside for a once only **Happy Chandler Trophy.**

Members are encouraged to seek out any person that might be interested in playing bowls, and to nurture them into the club. More players are badly wanted to fly the pennant flag.

A.G.M. 1964 Membership of the bowling club has dropped to 40 in number. The club again competed in the 2nd Division of the Ovens & Murray Pennants. We did not do as well as expected and, unfortunately our play was mostly away ,owing to our new green not being ready until late in the season. The R.B.Chandler Memorial Day was a great success and his photo was placed in the Bowling Club roms. The club also lost the services of Harold Hamilton, who has shifted to better his butchery business. He will be sadly missed, as he has given great service to the club.




KEY YEARS AND EVENTS 1982
